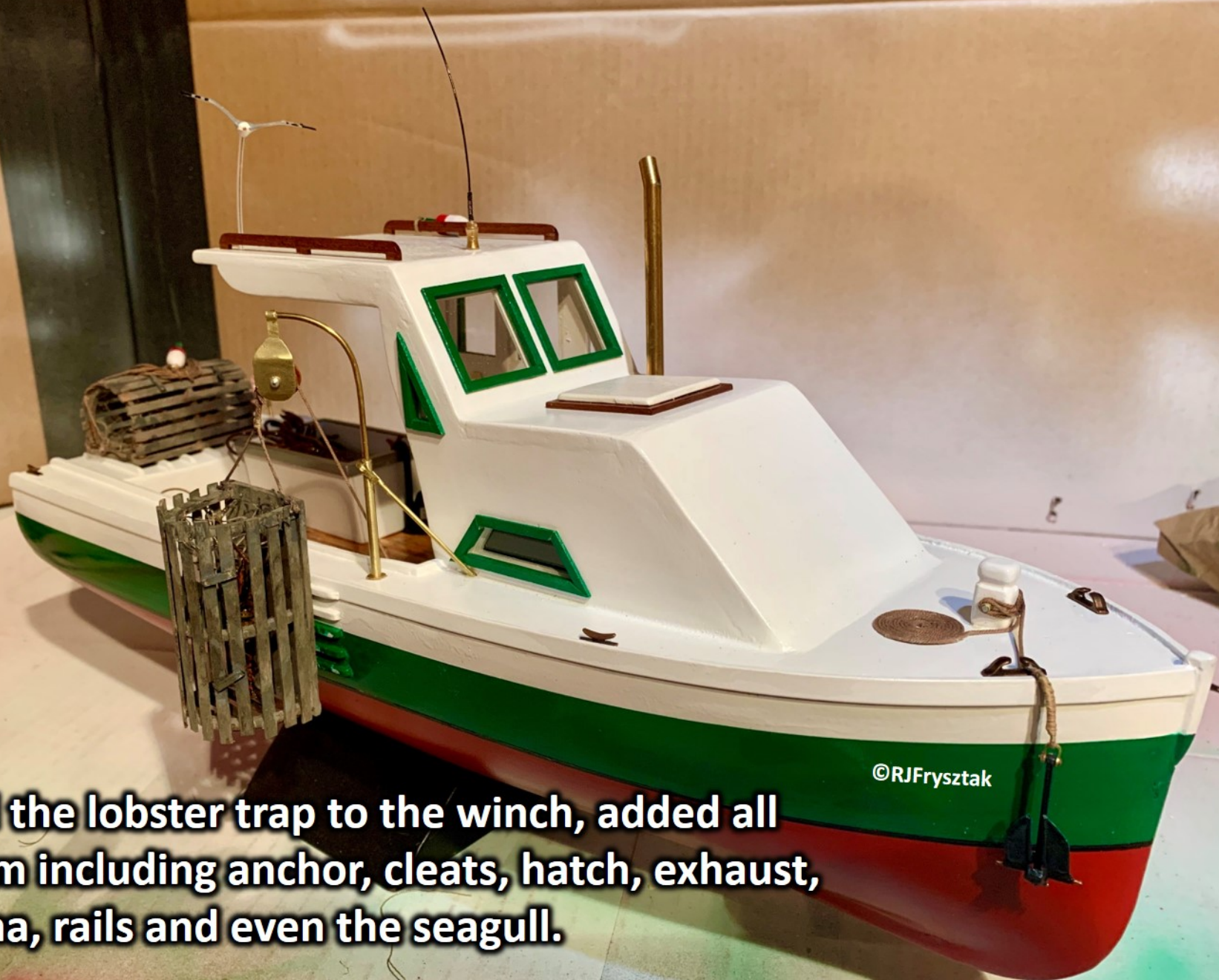

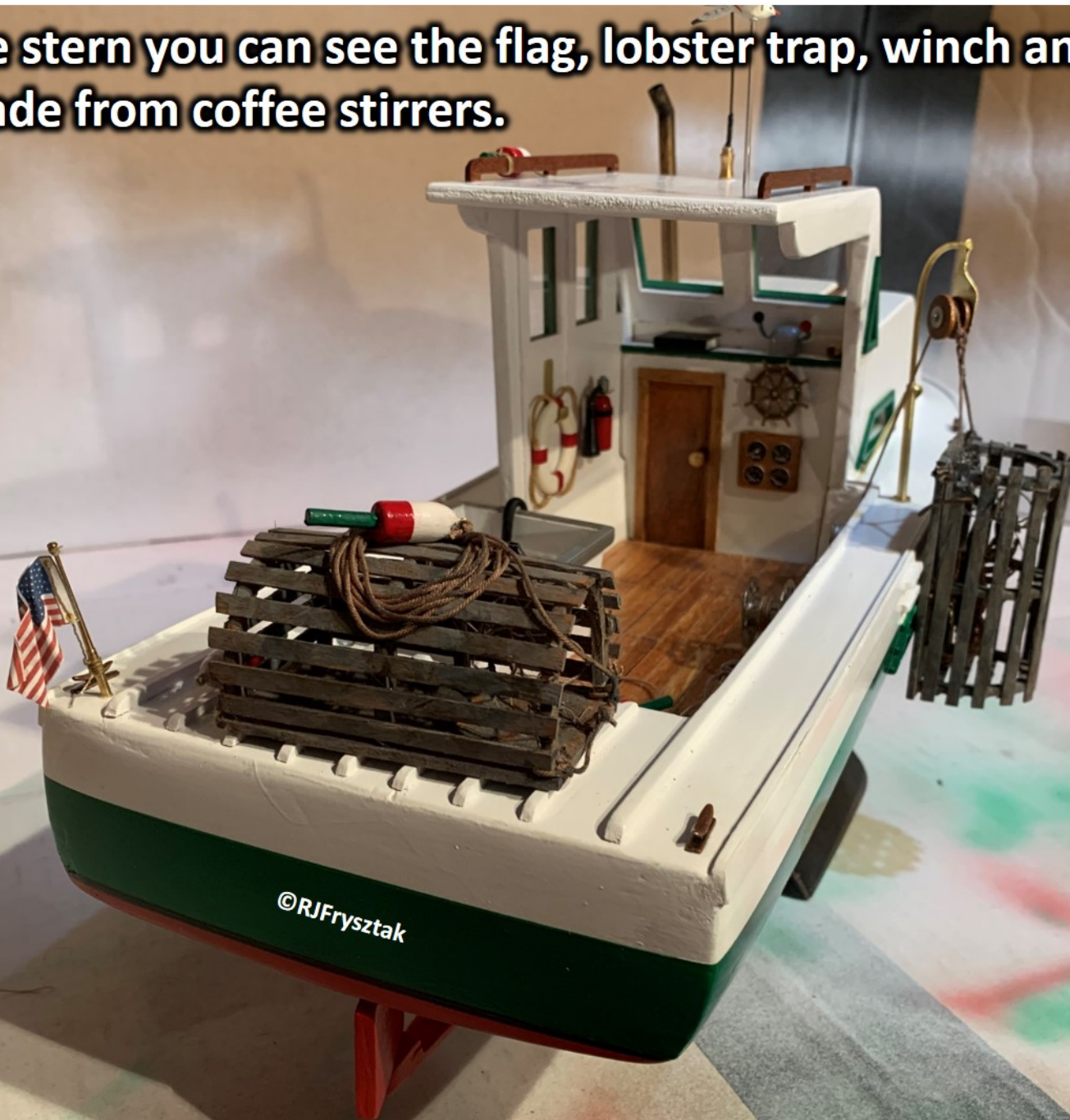


**All back together. Port side.
Installed 1/16" plexiglass windows and trimmed
with trim painted green to give it a bit of pop.**



Rigged the lobster trap to the winch, added all the trim including anchor, cleats, hatch, exhaust, antenna, rails and even the seagull.

From the stern you can see the flag, lobster trap, winch and the main deck, made from coffee stirrers.

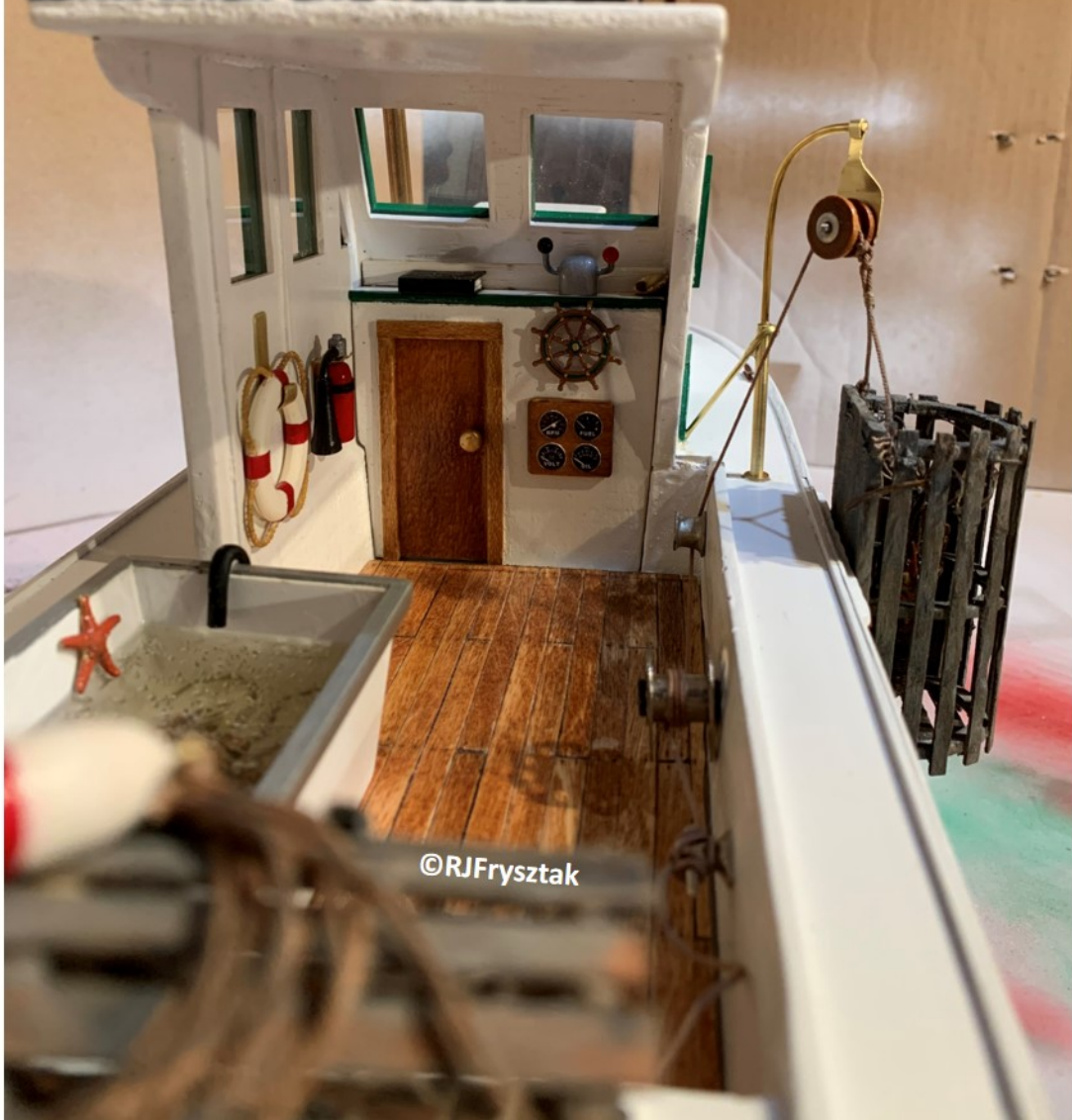


Inside the cabin you can see the wheel, gauges, door, throttle, log book and the lobster storage bin complete with two oversized lobsters.
