The Bermuda Boat Corsair by Dave Amstutz




In 1994, Clayton Feldman wrote a series of seminars on building the Bermuda boat *Corsair*, which was published in "Seaways Ships in Scale". For Dave Amstutz, it was love at first site. He decided to build a model of this handsome little vessel, which dated back to 1807.

The model is all cherry planking and some lighter strip wood, which was gleaned from a prior kit. All the blocks are also made from cherry.

Amstutz found out that during Feldman's research on this vessel, it was discovered that a model of this craft was once built by Merritt Edson. The piece was later sold to the State Department and subsequently presented to the King of Siam in 1967 by President Lyndon B. Johnson. Originally drawn by Howard I. Chapelle, the plans are available through the Smithsonian Institution, National Museum of American History, Division of Transportation.
